Welcome to *The Hokkaido Honeypot*. As you look around our little shop, you see many different types of honey. In a few minutes, you will taste the different flavors of honey, but before we do that, I'd like to tell you a little bit about the honeybees that worked so hard to make it.

Honey is produced by bees from the nectar—or juice—of flowers. Long ago, honey was almost the only form of sugar that humans could easily get. So, humans began managing honeybees long ago—about nine thousand years ago. The management of honeybees is known as beekeeping. Here at *The Hokkaido Honeypot*, we are not simply selling honey. We are beekeeping, just as humans have done for nine thousand years. From early spring to the end of autumn, we travel all over Japan with our honeybees, according to the time when the flowers bloom. Our various flavors of honey come from the different kinds of flowers that the bees have taken nectar from.

Honeybees live in large groups in nests called beehives. The members of the beehive are divided into three types. First, there is the queen bee. One queen runs the whole beehive. Her main job is to lay the eggs that will become the beehive's next generation of bees. The queen also produces chemicals that guide the behavior of the other bees. The queen can live up to five years. She is busiest in the summer months, when she can lay up to 2,500 eggs a day!

Next, there are the drones. These are the male bees, and their purpose is to mate with the new young queens. Unlike the queen bee and the worker bees, the drones do not have stingers. Several hundred drones live in each beehive during the spring and early summer. But when winter comes, the drones are kicked out of the beehive! Their job, mating with the next generation of queen bees, is over.

Finally, there are worker bees, which are all female. Their main role is to search for food, in other words, to bring back the pollen and nectar from flowers. The worker bees also build and protect the beehive. They also clean and circulate the air inside the beehive by beating their wings. When someone is very busy, in English we say they are "as busy as a bee". Obviously, it is these female worker bees that are so busy!

The average worker bee lives for just five to six weeks. During this time, she'll produce around 0.4 milliliters of honey. In other words, it takes 12 bees to produce just one teaspoon of honey. But why do they produce honey in the first place? In fact, they produce honey as food stores for the beehive during winter. Luckily for us, these hard-working female bees produce two to three times more honey than they need. So, even if we humans take half of the honey, there is still enough left for the bee colony to survive until spring.

Honeybees are so important, not just for honey, but because they help other plants grow! Bees transfer pollen between the male and female parts of the plant. Pollen is a fine yellow dust. This allows plants to grow seeds and fruit. Honeybees play an important role in agriculture because they pollinate a wide variety of domesticated plants. They pollinate over 100 kinds of crops. Many kinds of fruits and berries, vegetables, and nuts depend on bees. So in this way, honeybees support human life.

Now that you understand how important bees are for us humans, let's taste some honey. Today, you will taste honey made from three very different flowers: clover honey, cherry blossom honey, and buckwheat flower honey. Each one has its own unique and subtle flavor. I hope you will like them!
