How would you respond if you were asked to define health? The Charter of the World Health Organization*1 signed in 1946 and brought into force in 1948 considered people's health to be important to the attainment*2 of peace and security, and declares that "Health is a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being*3 and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity*4." From this viewpoint, when approaching various health problems, comprehensive*5 practices are required not only for the body but also for the human mind and social environment.

A survey by the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare*6 conducted in 2014 made it clear that there is an extremely meaningful relationship between the state of one's health and one's feeling of happiness. Health is important for the happiness of all people, and social welfare*7 uses specific methods to (7)achieve it. Therefore, there is a strong relationship between health and social welfare, and while Japan has a strong social support system relative to other developed nations, there are still areas that require attention.

For example, in recent years, the number of elderly people living with some kind of disease has been (1), which causes troubling mental and social issues, such as loneliness and isolation. Therefore, social support is essential to the health of the elderly.

(2), support such as adjustments in workplace environments is needed for the rising number of people suffering from mental health problems caused by chronic*8 social stress from daily life. Such health-related problems are closely linked (3) and have a major impact on all our daily lives.

Health-related issues are a particular threat to our well-being due to the stress they cause. For example, while more and more cancer patients are recovering (4) the progress in medical science, people still generally believe that cancer is a recurring*9, metastatic*10, incurable*11 disease. For this reason, cancer patients and their families often feel uncertainty, anxiety, and fear about the future. In addition, patients who have to quit their jobs to receive medical treatment will also experience (8)financial anxiety.

Another problem with cancer is that the family of a cancer patient is considered a "secondary*12 patient," and they are expected to play the necessary role of a caregiver*13.

This can have a major impact on the family's lifestyle. For example, the burden of taking on new roles, (5) housework and childcare, causes conflict within the

family and leads to the deterioration*¹⁴ of family relationships. Adding to that, family members of cancer patients who must provide end-of-life care*¹⁵ may have to make serious decisions on whether to provide life-prolonging treatments*¹⁶ or to allow them to die with dignity*¹⁷.

Thus, health-related problems involve not only physical treatment for the patient, but also the need for livelihood*¹⁸ support for the patient's family.

(6), health and social welfare are closely related with each other, and both must (9)take into account emotional and social issues. As a result, social welfare programs in Japan aim to strengthen human well-being and contribute to health by being engaged in solving life problems.
