Number 1

In the sixteenth century, the Spanish began to export potatoes to Europe from South America. At that time, there were frequent famines in rural areas in Europe. Potatoes, which are nutritious and easy to grow, saved many Europeans from starvation.

Number 2

Machine translation is being used more and more. Google Translate has reported that it translates 100 billion words a day. However, human translation will be better in cases in which figurative language is used, or the writer uses nuance in what she or he writes.

Number 3

Many people like to sing while taking a shower, and there are several reasons why people like to do that. Additionally, people's voices echo in the bathroom, and that makes their voices sound better to themselves.

Number 4

Snow monkeys live farther north and are better adapted to living in colder climates than any other type of monkey. Since they are the only type of monkey in Japan, Japanese simply refer to them as *saru*, which means 'monkey' in English.

Number 5

Japan has a long history of grape growing and wine making. Starting in the Meiji period in the 1870s, the national government encouraged grape growers to start producing wines. Currently, there are 28 varieties of wine grapes grown, and Yamanashi and Kanagawa are probably the most well-known wine producing areas. Wine making areas have begun to have autumn wine celebrations during the harvest season.

- 1 Japan only very recently started to produce wines.
- 2 Nagano and Miyazaki are currently the most famous wine making areas in Japan.
- 3 There are nearly thirty different types of wine grapes grown in Japan.
- 4 Wine was first drunk in Japan by the Meiji emperor.
