### 1 次の英文を読み、下の設問に答えよ。(\* は、本文の下の注を見よ。)

Stories are a powerful form of communication. We use them to make sense of the world, to share our emotions, and to teach others. Visual storytelling is especially ( 1 ) because images can have a powerful impact on our emotions. Photographers catch a moment that they hope will engage their viewers. Photographer Renée Byer says, "In this fast-paced world, . . . a still photograph stops time. It gives the viewer a moment to think, to react, to feel."

Two National Geographic photographers — Joel Sartore and Rubén Salgado Escudero — approach visual storytelling in different ways. They use a range of techniques to tell stories through their photos. Sartore has been photographing animals for more than 25 years in an effort to raise public awareness about them. Salgado Escudero uses photos to make human connections across the world.

Joel Sartore began his career photographing \*endangered species in their natural \*habitat. He hoped that his photos would inspire people and governments to care about these animals. After several years, he changed his approach and started a new project called Photo Ark, with the goal to photograph all the animals in our world's zoos and aquariums. (2) photographing the animals in their habitats, he began taking their portraits. A portrait is a very formal type of painting or photo. It is usually of a person standing or sitting alone, against a plain background. But Sartore started to use this technique with animals. Some of the portraits are funny, some are sad, but in most of them, the animals look straight out at us. And we look into their eyes. This technique captures the eye contact of the animals, making the animals seem almost human. Sartore does this deliberately, knowing that when animals look human, they are likely to prompt a powerful emotional response. He wants the public to fall in love with these animals, to connect with them, and to care about them. Sartore considers each animal equally important. When he photographs small animals, such as insects and frogs, he makes them look as big as a tiger. He wants to give each endangered animal an equal voice.

Sartore's goal is not simply to create a set of beautiful photos; he wants the Photo Ark to change viewers' minds and behavior. The disappearance of an insect or a frog may not seem very important, but every animal is an important link in nature. Sartore says we should not "think that we can destroy one species . . . after another and not affect humanity. When we save species, we're actually saving (3)." He hopes that the Photo Ark will allow each animal to tell its story. And he hopes that these stories will convince people to make better choices about how and where they live, what they eat and wear, and how they spend their money.
