

Volunteer at the Osaka Community Fun Run!

The Global Gender Gap Report has been published by the World Economic Forum in Switzerland since 2006 to explain gender equality around the world. In the 2021 report, which ranked 156 countries, Scandinavian countries were once again in the top five, not other advanced economies like the US and Japan. In terms of political empowerment and economic participation and opportunity, the US and Japan rank lower as democratic countries. Furthermore, the two countries' contrasting ranks indicate that their situations are quite different.

In terms of political empowerment in 2021, the US at 37th place (0.329) and Japan at 147th (0.061) rank low as democratic countries, indicating a wide range between their ranks and different situations. The total percentage of female members in the US Congress and the Japanese Diet was about 30% and 9.9% respectively. It has been said that the US election system could be a cause of difficulty for women to become members of Congress. In Japan, research on the obstacles against women becoming a member of the Diet reported that 58.8% of respondents mentioned lack of specialist knowledge, 47.8% the difficulty of balancing housework and childcare, 40.9% the lack of privacy, and 34.8% cited sexual harassment.

In terms of the economic participation and opportunity index, the work environments of these two countries are also very different. The US ranks 30th at 0.75, and Japan ranks 120th at 0.6. These rankings are calculated from salary gaps, the ratio of management positions, and the number of specialists and engineers. In regards to the percentage of female CEOs in domestic companies, it is estimated that the US stands at 25% and Japan at 12%. Women in both countries experience difficulty

having a career as well as a family and face discrimination in large organizations, often referred to as the 'glass ceiling.'

In conclusion, the US and Japan ranked lower than expected as democratic and economically advanced countries, and their situations are very different as shown by the wide range of their rankings. However, in order to increase female political empowerment, various NPOs are supporting women by providing knowledge, skills, and even financial aid in both the US and Japan. By 44 support systems like these, it is hoped that both countries will come closer to gender equality in the near future.
