James Kane of New York City is a fisherman. But he does not eat what he catches.

Instead of catching fish, he uses powerful magnets attached to long ropes to “fish” for trash in the city’s lakes, rivers and ponds.

Sometimes he pulls out trash, like old car parts.

But recently, Kane said he found a heavy metal box called a safe. People use safes to store valuable items such as money, gold coins, jewelry or important documents. A safe has a door that swings open and can be locked.

Last Friday, Kane and his girlfriend pulled out the safe, opened it and found wet bags of \$100 bills.

They recorded it on video.

“Oh, that’s money,” Kane said in the video of the discovery. “Oh, my God!” his girlfriend said.

The pair said they found almost \$100,000 in hundred-dollar bills. However, many of the bills were in bad shape and some were stuck together. It is not clear how many of the bills can be recovered and used again.

Many of the bills showed recent markings - Kane said he plans to bring the found money to *the Bureau of Engraving and Printing to have them replaced with new bills.

When Kane and his girlfriend found the money, they called the police to investigate. According to a police statement, the money was not connected to a crime, so the couple is permitted to keep it. But the police warned the money was in very bad condition.

“I guess you call it a *finders keepers thing,” Kane said.

Kane records his fishing outings and puts the results on social media.

He has found bicycles, guns, jewelry and even a war weapon. He often calls the police. Some videos show police taking possession of the dangerous objects.

Magnet fishers work all over the country. They find things many others do not because they use very powerful magnets and ropes. These things let them reach parts of water far away from land. One magnet fisher found a human *skull attached to an exercise weight. Another found a gun and the belongings of two people who were killed nine years ago.

Many people see the popularity of the magnet fishers on YouTube and wonder if the videos are real. In comments, they wonder if the finds are placed in the water ahead of time to make a good video.

Kane said he may just be lucky.

“I have seen and worked with other magnet fishers who keep coming back to the same place for three months, and I’ll come along and throw the same magnet and get and find something that they’ve been trying to get the entire time,” he said. “I personally can’t explain that.”

Kane and his girlfriend have ideas for how to spend their \$100,000. They plan

to buy a new vehicle and more equipment so they can make better videos of their magnet fishing adventures.

Researchers in Japan say they will begin selling new devices that will help people reduce how much *sodium, or salt, they use to improve the taste of their food.

One new device is an electric spoon. It uses a small computer worn on a person's arm to send electrical signals to activate sodium atoms. The developers say the signals increase the food's salty taste.

The Electric Salt Spoon will sell in Japan for around \$120 beginning in June. Professor Homei Miyashita developed the spoon and a similar device, electric chopsticks. The chopsticks will likely go on sale next year.

The recent announcement marks the first time the technology has been used in a product for sale to the public. Last year, the effort gained a different sort of attention. It won the 2023 Ig Nobel Prize in Nutrition. Organizers describe the prize as recognizing research that makes "people LAUGH, then THINK."

The devices both use a weak electrical current to send the sodium *ions from food, through the chopsticks or spoon, to the mouth where they create a sense of saltiness, said Miyashita.

"As a result, the salty taste increases one and a half times," he said.

Miyashita and his team have studied how technology can link up with and produce human senses. He has also created a TV screen that allows users to experience the taste of food.

Another company is turning to healthcare products to expand its traditional business. A company representative said the technology might be especially useful

for Japanese people, whose traditional diet favors salty foods. The average adult in Japan consumes about 10 grams of salt per day. The *World Health Organization recommends half that amount.

Eating foods with too much sodium can increase the chances of having high blood pressure, strokes and other health problems.
