With statues of the Buddha and local gods, candles and smelling sticks, Lee Kyoung-hyun's temple looks similar to those of Korean *shamans from centuries past.

But the 29-year-old shaman — also known as “Baby Angel” — reaches her clients in a thoroughly modern way: through social media accounts with hundreds of thousands of followers.

“*Shamanism was believed to be an invisible, mysterious and spiritual world,” Lee said, adding that she had noticed more South Korean shamans posting videos about the spiritual practice since she started her own YouTube channel in 2019.

South Korea is among the world’s most modern and high-tech economies. More than half its population of 51 million is not religiously connected, polls show. But the appeal of shamanism has worked well for a long time.

Kim Dong-kyu of the Academic Center for K-Religions at Sogang University, a private research university in Seoul, said shamans used to promote themselves in newspapers. It was a “natural phenomenon” to turn to social media, he said.

*Google Trends shows that searches on YouTube for “shaman” and *“fortune-telling” in Korean have nearly doubled over the past five years.

The spiritual tradition was central to the story of a very successful South Korean movie this year, ‘Exhuma,’ where shamans had the job of removing a curse from a family.

The movie illustrates well-dressed shamans in their 20s and 30s and director Jang Jae-hyun said he discovered many young shamans while doing his research.

The movie has made at least 132 billion *won (\$97 million) internationally, raising interest in the religious tradition. Roughly one in five South Koreans has seen 'Exhuma,' according to Korean Film Council data.

"People used to hide that they live as a shaman. There was a lot of shame," said 51-year-old Eunmi Pang, who has been a shaman for almost 20 years. She said that shamans today were more willing to express and promote themselves.

Shamans — who are believed to have fortune-telling abilities — typically charge around 100,000 won (\$73.09) for a consultation of between 30 and 60 minutes, according to Pang and online pricing lists. They offer relationship advice, guidance on job searches and future telling, said Lee.

Shamans typically answer questions after conducting ceremonies that may involve ringing bells and tossing grains of rice.

They also sing, dance, and walk on the edge of a knife to ask for help from the gods. While practices vary, many Korean shamans worship local gods like the Mountain God, Great Spirit Grandmother, and Dragon King.

Park Chea-bin, a 33-year-old Buddhist, visited Lee when she was struggling to find a job in 2020. She said she felt "peace of mind" after consulting Lee.

"I was very anxious at the time but I became a little relaxed after deciding to let things go and focus on what I need to do," said Park, who found employment at roughly the same time. "I'm a Buddhist but I know Christians around me who come for their concerns."

Taylor Swift will celebrate making Grammys history with a series of concerts in Tokyo starting Wednesday. This is the beginning of a month of sold-out shows in Asia.

Excited fans lined up in the cold from morning to buy merchandise at Tokyo Dome before the first of four Tokyo shows, part of the famous singer's global tour — the first billion-dollar-tour ever.

"It's us, hi! We are Swifties from Taiwan!" read a large fabric sign featuring 10 pictures of Swift's face, held up by a group of fans outside the 55,000-capacity arena.

Results of a ticket lottery for Swift's Japan dates were announced in July, with some fans traveling to Tokyo, even (36) the tour was coming to them.

"We came just for the concert as we couldn't get tickets in Australia," laughed 18-year-old Ebony Donohue. "I'm so excited to finally see her. All her music is so different. She's so strong and amazing."

Other fans from places Swift won't stop this time, including Thailand, the Philippines and China, joined the vast crowd that gathered in the afternoon before the concert.

Saya Matsuo, 25, said he had been waiting years for this moment.

"I've been listening to her songs since I was in middle school, about 10 years. This is the first time I'll see her in concert, and I've been so excited since the moment we were able to get tickets," he said. "She is someone who can grab people's hearts, make people sing and dance. I love her personality."

Swift-fever has become very exciting worldwide after the 34-year-old (40) her fourth album of the year prize at the Grammys on Sunday.
